

Rule Change Proposals and Amendments received in accordance with Rule 20 by 31 December 2007 and 21 March 2008 respectively.

Additional sentence at the end of Rule 8h(iv)

If a player refuses to abide by their club rules and their appeal is over ruled then that club may cancel the registration of the player subject to the approval of the League.

Amendment to Proposal 3

If a player refuses to abide by their club rules and their appeal is over ruled then that club may apply to the Age Group Player Registration Secretary to cancel the registration of the player.

New Rule 2(f)

Each Club shall provide an email address for the receipt of fixture changes and referee appointments. This address will be that of the Club Secretary or his/her nominated proxy.

5) S

Addition to Rule 11(b)

The Home Club shall telephone the result of each match to the Age Group Fixtures Secretary by 6.00pm on the day of the match, this includes both Tyro and County Cup games.

6) S

Amended Rule 2(b)

The Annual Subscription shall be £ 45.00 per team payable on or before 31st May in each year.

7) S

New Rule 2(g)

Each team must nominate a single ground on which to play their home games. The kick off time for these home matches will be as Rule 10(b). The Under 11, Under 14, and Under 15's at 10.00am, and the Under 12 and Under 13's at 2.00pm.

Any team that will have difficulty in complying with these kick-off times may make application through its Club Secretary to the appropriate Age Group Fixtures Secretary requesting a change. In the event that this request is granted, the amended time will relate to every home game played by that team.

Any team requiring to deviate from either the venue or the kick off time for a specific game must, through its Club Secretary, agree the change with the appropriate Age Group Fixtures Secretary not less than 7 days prior to the scheduled date of the game and also advise their opponents and the match officials of such change of venue and/or kick off time.

Additional paragraph to Rule 23 (iii) Proposal 1:

All teams shall play in the 1st round of the main cup, the losers qualify for the sub cup. If there is an odd number of teams then three teams will have to take a bye, unless time allows for a qualifying round (e.g. if teams have a bye on Hampshire Cup 1st round day) when two teams will play off to reach the 1st round of the main cup, losers qualifying for the sub cup. If byes are required, consideration shall be given to have as few byes as possible, but before the competition reaches the quarterfinal stage. (i.e. The latest you could have a bye would be to get into the last eight), unless a team has dropped out/failed to fulfil a fixture at a later stage.

Additional paragraph to Rule 23 (iii) Proposal 2:

Alternatively, if the number of teams in an age group can be conveniently split, (e.g. an even number of divisions) teams in the upper divisions (e.g. 1, 2 and 3) will compete in the Main Cup, and the lower divisions (e.g. 4, 5, and 6) will compete in the Sub Cup. The first round of each cup would involve all teams (as long as numbers are even) and apply the same policy on byes as in proposal 1. Each age group will decide which policy to adopt before the season starts, by show of hands at the August managers meetings.

Amendment to Proposal 8

Each age group committee will decide what format the leagues' cup competitions will take for their own age group:

Format 1: If the number of teams in the age group can be conveniently split, teams in the upper divisions (e.g. 1, 2 and 3) will compete in the main cup, and the lower divisions (e.g. 4, 5 and 6) will compete in the sub cup.

Format 2: All teams in the age group will enter the main cup; those that lose in the first round will enter the sub cup.

In both formats all teams will compete in the first round wherever possible. Consideration shall be given to have as few byes as possible, if byes are required they must take place before the quarterfinal stage, (i.e. the latest you could have a bye would be to reach the last eight), unless a team has dropped out/ failed to fulfil a fixture at a later stage.

If there are an odd number of teams, three will have to take a bye at the first round stage, or in the case of format 2, if time allows, the league may arrange a qualifying round when two teams will play off to reach the 1st round of the main cup, losers qualifying for the sub cup.

Amendment to Rule 13 (E) Change mandated by Hampshire FA Limited

Match Officials appointed under this Rule shall be entitled to charge standard class public transport expenses or private car expenses of 26p per mile and any other permitted expenses actually incurred together with the following match fees:-

Referee £ 14.00. Registered Referees appointed as Assistant Referees £ 8.00. Subject to any limits laid down by Hampshire Football Association Limited.

The Home Club shall pay the Officials their fees and expenses immediately after the match.
